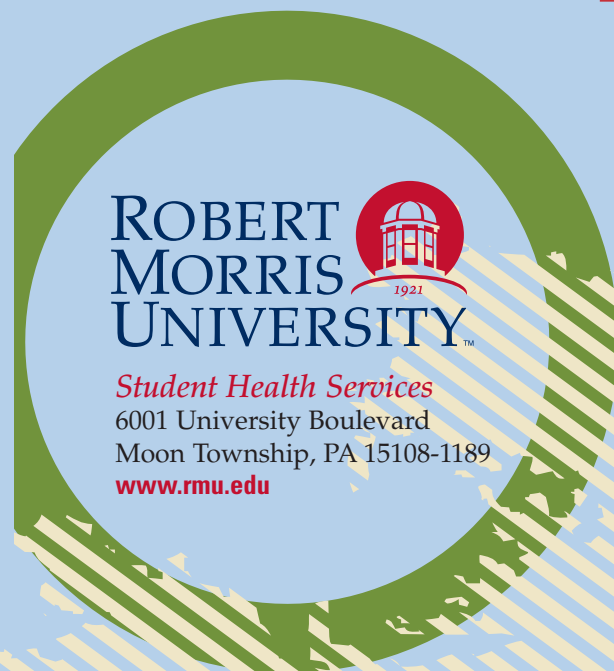

STUDENT HEALTH SERVICES

Student Health Services serves as the University's "primary care" office, paying special attention to the unique needs of young adults. Our staff is committed to the concept of wellness and hopes that students come to the office for wellness information, as well as for help when ill or injured.

We believe that traditional medical care is only one part of health care. Equally important is self-care, which involves functioning on one's own behalf to promote a healthy lifestyle and detect and prevent illness.



We would like to be partners in your health care and help you identify areas of self-improvement that could lead to higher levels of physical, emotional and spiritual well-being.

STUDENT HEALTH INSURANCE

The University requires all traditional undergraduate students, both full- and part-time, to carry health insurance coverage. Graduate and adult and continuing education students in the following groups are also bound by this requirement: resident students, international students, nursing students, intercollegiate athletes and club sport participants.

If you do not have your own health insurance, RMU offers an affordable plan. To learn more about the plan, visit www.rmu.edu/studentinsurance. To enroll, simply fill out the online enrollment form, and the yearly premium will be charged to your RMU student account.

If you have your own health insurance and wish to waive RMU insurance coverage, complete and submit the online waiver form, which will be sent automatically to Student Health Services.



CONFIDENTIALITY

Student medical information is considered confidential and will not be released without the student's written consent, except in the following cases:

1. A health or safety emergency, where disclosure is necessary to protect the health and safety of the student, other students, members of the University community or the public
2. A court-ordered disclosure, or as otherwise required by law

Under these circumstances, disclosure of student medical information is limited to parties who have a legitimate interest in the welfare of the student and/or the health and safety of the general public.

HEALTH FORMS

All students – resident and commuter – are required to have a completed health form on file with Student Health Services prior to the start of classes. Failure to comply may result in restriction of use of campus health services.

RESIDENT STUDENTS

General care is provided to all resident students. Some non-prescription medications are provided free of charge. Costs for any medications prescribed by the University physician are the responsibility of the student. Student Health Services will assist students in obtaining appointments with physicians, dentists and other health care providers in the community, if necessary. Any fees incurred for these services are also the responsibility of the student.



State law mandates the meningitis vaccine for all college students living on campus. Therefore, resident students must either get the vaccine or sign a waiver stating that they have chosen not to be vaccinated for religious or other reasons. COMMUTER STUDENTS

Commuter students may visit Student Health Services for routine health issues or emergency situations, but must complete a medical assessment form and pay a \$10 fee (cash only) before being seen by the nurse or physician. Otherwise, the student will be provided with a referral list of medical practices and services in the community. In the event of an emergency, the student will be seen, and forms and payment will be handled at a later time.

ACCIDENTS

All accidents must be reported to Student Health Services.

PHYSICAL DISABILITIES

Students with physical disabilities that require special accommodations should contact the Center for Student Success at 412-262-8349.



MEDICAL EXCUSES

Student Health Services does not issue medical excuses covering class absences, missed examinations, etc. The student's instructor may call the nurse for verification of the student's visit. For serious and long-term illness, please contact the Dean of Students Office at 412-262-8346.

MEDICAL EMERGENCY

If an emergency occurs when Student Health Services is closed, resident students should contact their resident assistant (RA) or area coordinator (AC). If these individuals are not available, students should contact Public Safety at 412-397-2424 for assistance or to request an ambulance.
