Course Information

ARTM3195 "Design Italiano!" (3 credits)

Prerequisite: HUMA1010 or any ARTM course. Instructor permission required. Contact willish@rmu.edu for more information.

Students will travel to Italian destinations such as Florence, Venice, and Milan to study art and design history in context. We will look at historic and contemporary art and design artifacts, economics, tools, and interdisciplinary developments, and reflect on how Italian art and political times have been intertwined in the Renaissance, Modern, and Contemporary times. Through readings, site visits, class discussions and presentations, and reflective blogging, students will gain understanding of the impact of Art and Design on the economics, politics, and identity of a culture.

Cost

The \$3,500 program fee includes: airfare, housing, most meals, mandatory excursions (for example, museum fees, company visits, historical sites), and supplementary travel insurance.

The fee does not include: personal spending money, some meals, elective (free time) excursions, passport fees, overweight baggage fees.

The tuition for this course is covered by your Spring 2019 tuition payment (if taking between 12-18 credits).

- December 4, 2018: \$500 Deposit Due (\$250 non-refundable)
- January 15, 2019: \$1,500 Second Payment Due
- February 19, 2019: \$1,500 Final Payment Due

Scholarships

Travel Guidelines

The international travel component of this program includes travel from Pittsburgh International Airport to the country and back. No exceptions will be made concerning alternate travel arrangements.

To Register

All students must have at least a 2.5 GPA following the Fall 2018 semester in order to participate.

Students can register for the course by logging into Sentry Secured Services and adding this course to their Spring 2019 schedule.

- \$500 deposit
